Many of the plants along the Parkway have become old and woody or have grown too tall and have to be removed from under the power lines or are obstructing traffic views. Some simply require too much maintenance which translates to expense. For your information, the Islands are numbered from #1, at the entrance to #7 which ends the Parkway at Dover Drive S. A demonstration project was planted at Island #2 last year and the group learned a lot regarding plant density, people's preferences, and the cost of plantings. This project was done so that the entire Parkway would have the benefit of the experience gained at Island #2.

The committee and additional volunteers are now working on Islands #6 & #7. By the time you read this these islands will probably be half finished. We still have Islands #1, #3, #4 & #5 to go and we need your input, both physical and mental. This small group cannot do it alone. Every one of you is welcome to the meetings and work parties. PARKWAY PLANTINGS UPDATED

On February 15, 2007 Ed Bingle of Bingle's Tree Care, LLC, North Port, removed 6 Cabbage Palm trees, 2 Oleander bushes, 1 Carrotwood Tree, 3 Bottlebrush trees, 1 Pygmy Date Palm and trimmed 2 Crepe Myrtles on Islands #6 & #7. The Palm trees, Pygmy Date Palm and the Oleander bushes were old and were no longer attractive and needed to be replaced. The Carrotwood is an illegal tree and is very invasive, so that needed to be removed and replaced with more appropriate trees. All the trees had their stumps ground, so there are no unsightly stumps on the two islands. Ed did an outstanding job leaving the area where he worked clean and ready for replanting. Approximately one week before Ed removed the trees, Jim Flowerday, Mary Lou Frederick, Don Frederick and Fred Kern used Don's truck to pull out numerous old and woody Hibiscus bushes. Thanks to these four people, we didn't have to pay someone to remove the bushes.

You may have noticed that we had to remove the beautiful blue century plants at the corner of Oakwood Drive and the Parkway. They had grown too large and became a safety issue for people turning at that corner.
